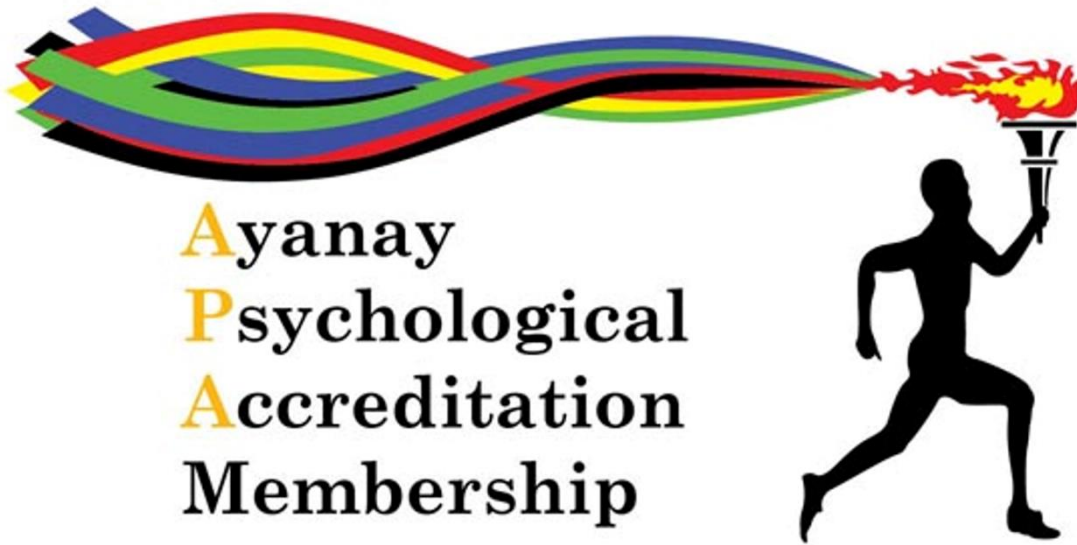

The Rampage Collection are the only programmes designed to bring Young People, their Carers and their Social Care Professional together in the same learning environment.

It is also the only set of programmes, specifically focused on the 'psychological lockdown' phases of the human brain.

The Rampage Collection offers the widest ranging, series of programmes that deliver genuine, core skills development that have been shown to have long term benefits for those that assimilate the concepts into their daily routines.

Designed for 3 specifically targeted groups connected to the Social Care Sector.

- 11-14year olds, Their Carers and Their Professional Key Worker
- 16-19year olds with a Higher Dependency, Social Care Professionals, Educators and Carers.
- Professionals working with young people connected to the Social Care and Justice sectors.

ON YOUR MARKS & READY, SET, GO!



These programmes are designed to support any young person that has experienced an institutionalised environment, including the 35% of Care Leavers across the UK that do find a route into Education, Employment or Training (NEET's). By allowing the development of Core Skills Young people can increase their engagement with the amazing opportunities that exist already.

With the support of The APA Community Learning Platform and the approach taken in the delivery of these programmes, participants can discover their potential and start to excel.

This 2-part programme is designed to be delivered during the final year of a placement in whatever institutionalised environment a young person might be. A social Care Setting, a justice setting, a residential education setting, a sport focused arena (eg. An Elite Sports Academy)

It is in the duty of care for all institutionalised health, care, and education providers to protect the well-being of those they serve. Increasing not only the young person's skills for independent living and employability, but also their life-long coping and resilience skills is the best delivery of that duty of care.

By delivering this programme in the way we do, young people can commit to and work positively towards their future, with a supported focus and reduce the risks of long-term dependency on the social care systems.

It is hoped that this programs will become part of the Transition Plan for every young person connected to institutionalised environments, with Local authorities including it as evidence of capability, prior to issuing Local Authority Tenancies.

PART 2: READY, SET, GO!

This part of the programme is a Task book system of evidence-based development. With 2 sessions a month for 10 months. (Session duration is 4 hours, 80 hours total.)

Each month will have a set series of tasks that support the participants towards increased independent living, Social engagement, and improved employability.

Session Topics for this part of the programme will include:

- TUB Ratings
- Decision Making
- Getting on TRACK
- Building a positive wall
- Who am I?
- My Story, My Future

NB: This program does not currently include awareness components around, Nutrition, Physical Health, Cooking Skills or Fitness. The APA Community Learning Platform does however, currently work with other sector teams to link these components when deemed appropriate. This allows a Service Provider the full scope of support and we can, therefore, offer a fully bespoke package.



COLLABORATIVE PARENTAL SUPPORT

Allowing a Parent or Statutory Agency to focus their efforts on these foundations will positively enhance the effectiveness and sustainability of a family experiencing engagement with statutory agencies.

APA's Parental Support Package is designed as a triad of support.

Package

Part 1: Psychological Support and Focus

6 hours of dedicated Coaching support. (4x 90minute sessions)

Supporting a Parent or Guardian to

- Elevate the engagement with statutory agencies.
- Provide a constructive framework for future engagement.
- Increase the confidence and understanding of the process.
- Create a focus on positive communication.

NOTE: Where Therapeutic engagement is required by a Court Direction, APA recommends use of an APA Qualified Accredited Professional of the Parents Choice. Where such directions are made, it would not be ethical to undertake this package, until the Therapeutic work has been completed.

Part 2: Independent Review of Information to be used in a Family Court Bundle

A review of documentation that will inevitably constitute a Court Bundle (known as 'The Paperwork'). As this package is designed as an early intervention, The review will build the level foundations for proceeding, with parties having knowledge and agreement of the information included in the documentation to be used moving forward. The review, therefore, highlights concerns and risks relating to:

- Inconsistencies
- Contradictions
- Misrepresentations
- Code of Conduct or Ethical Concerns

This review is designed to support a parent in producing a balanced and effective response to the information contained in the 'Paperwork'. This package does not produce the response on behalf of a parent. Nor does this seek to remove information that parties seek to present.



Part 3: Guidance of a Parental Structured and Sustainable Plan Proposal

A parental proposal for structured and sustainable action plan for a child, supports a parent to formulate a balanced care plan proposal, this is a key part of the record that reflects the desire of a parent to seek a solution that protects the best interests of a child. By offering the Statutory Agency a Parental Structured and Sustainable Plan Proposal, it allows for increased dialogue between parties that supports the development of an effective Care Plan that all parties can agree on.

This allows the parent to offer a meaningful contribution to proceedings that focus on:

- Overview of child's current status
- Outline of Parental Concerns
- Immediate Factors
- Long-term Elements
 - Health
 - Education
 - Social Integration
 - Reactionary Traits

Action Plan - 6 months | 12 months | 24 months

Value of The Collaborative Parental Support Package

APA's Parental Support Package can be used by a Parent directly, a Statutory Agency that wishes to ensure the protection of due diligence, or by External Support Advocates acting on behalf of a parent.

Through APA's network of Collaboration Partners and APA's Directory of Qualified Accredited Professionals APA is able to sign post external services and support platforms, that can add value to a family connected to Family Court proceedings.

The value of APA's Parental Support Package is composed of the benefit to the Children, Families, Professionals, Statutory Agencies and External Support Advocates.

Children:

The value to children is that they are maintained as the primary point of focus. By providing the oversight review of 'The Paperwork', Children are better protected from an unbalanced view being used as a singular presentation to the court.



Families:

The value to families is that the Child's immediate and long term physical, emotional, social & psychological well-being is the primary concern. This mitigates any parental discord and conflict. In reducing this factor, families can expedite the healing process and build towards an effective and safe relationship for all parties.

Professionals:

The complexity and emotional engagement that is involved in working with Family Court processes, will be a conduit to poor Mental Health, leading to poor Physical Health and ultimately weaken the Professional's capacity to engage in the way they wish to. By allowing for an early intervention with the support of APA's Collaborative Parental Support Package, Professionals can reduce their risk of burn out and increase their positive engagement with the parents they are working with.

Statutory Agencies:

The value of APA's Collaborative Parental Support Package for Statutory Agencies is in the enhancement of positive parental engagement and the creation of balanced and sustainable responses that encourage positive relationships to be built and maintained without prolonged statutory involvement.

External Support Advocates:

This group includes legal representatives, Peer Support Platforms, Parental Advocacy Groups and Wider Family Support Networks.

Traditionally, support of this kind has always been targeted to situations, following State Intervention or Civil Legal Action. This has been proven to be damaging to children and families, both in the short and long term development of healthy relationships.

APA's Collaborative Parental Support Package is a tool that allows Children, Parents and their families to build positive engagement and empowers quicker resolution that can only showcase the efficiency and effectiveness of the External Support Advocate to deliver their service.

AIMS

It is hoped that successful completion of the programs will become part of the Transition Plan for every justice leaver, with Local authorities including it as evidence of capability, prior to issuing Local Authority Tenancies. The approach taken to support those connected to the justice sector, is a development from the educational base, currently in use by the UK Justice Sector.

Steps to Success has been developed from generations of psychological knowledge and positive human development. By using this knowledge, the programme empowers participants to develop their own choices and engage in positive actions for their future. Thus, diverting people from the negative influences and environments that often create the cycle of manipulation, reaction and desperation that form the core triad of reoffending.

1976: Was the year in which domestic violence was acknowledged in UK law.

1976ers refers to anyone (male or female, of any age) that is experiencing Abuse in the Home (AITH) and seeking to escape from the situation. With many legal and functional adaptations and developments coming into existence over the ensuing 4 decades, most of the developments have been the result of 'Survivors' tirelessly fighting to improve the systemic processes for those that experience, these life changing environments.

APA has seen how, in the past all changes have been focused on elements of the situation, changing a piece here, reframing an operational interaction there, never giving a systemic support, that works collectively. It has been shown repeatedly, that when all the elements in a person's life are working together, the environment for long term survival, is created and people can break the cycle of abuse.

Areas of primary concern this programme addresses:

- Loss of employment due to low levels of Abuse In The Home awareness in the workplace.
- Disjointed and ineffective support and learning to transition from abusive environments.
- A low level of professional learning for most therapeutic professionals in training.



THE AIMS

- Support employers to provide better responses to those experiencing Abuse In The Home.
- Provide effective transition programmes for those going through external support service provision.
- Provide Elevated Psychological Learning for any professional that works with 1976ers.

The 1976ers programme is delivered by Qualified Accredited Members of APA. The programme brings together and collaborates with the best advocates for effective working and elevated practice.

OUTCOMES

- More 1976ers being able to remain in employment.
- An increase in Employer awareness of how 1976ers can impact on the workplace.
- Improved Workplace responses to disclosures of Abuse in the home.
- Greater protection of those experiencing abuse in the home.
- Improved networking and support for those affected.

THE DESIRED, LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

- A dedicated 1976ers 1st responder in the workplace.
- Dedicated awareness training for all in pastoral care, duty of care roles, HR management.
- Systemic delivery of effective transition learning for all 1976ers.
- Consistent and effective increase in awareness for everyone in psychologically based training, (Therapists, Counsellors, Coaches)
- The removal of the labelling 'Domestic Abuse Survivor' with the replacement of the term '1976er'

OVERVIEW

Elevated Service Programme (Hospitality), (EHP) offers a uniquely comprehensive system of hospitality focused training, linked to increasing core skills and psychological awareness.



The Elevated Service Programme is a collaboration psychological understandings, that blends Principles of The Pellin Institute and The APA Community Learning Platform. The EHP gives targeted support to young people connected to the social care sector, this can be 'Fostered Children', as well as the Children of Foster Parents. (These 2 groups will be collectively treated as 'Connected Young People')

The 4 level, multi-site Programme provides young people with the best global introduction to the hospitality industry. Raising the bar, in both ethical and operational delivery of service, while never losing sight of the guest experience, and the importance of effective interactions in the service environment.

WHO IS THIS FOR?

The Levels



Introduction: Transitional Support for Connected Young People.

Delivered within the hospitality environment. 1 day a week for 10 weeks.

Level One: Selection & Induction for all Operational Agents (O. A's). No one will be addressed as a trainee. This level will include statutory certifications in Fire, Health & Safety, and First Aid. This process will take a total of 31 working days and takes place away from operational delivery. (This can be delivered as a 50 / 50 time split with operational delivery).

- Introduction to Service
- Service NOT Servitude

Level Two: Operational Modules. This will take a maximum of 20 weeks to complete. This level includes dedicated focus on:

- Interactions
- Team Focus
- Communication and Passive Listening
- When Things Go Wrong
- Solution: The Way Forward
- Effective Decision Making

Level Three: Advanced Modules. This will take a maximum of 24 weeks to complete. This level includes dedicated focus on:

- Perseverance & the Contribution from Hurt
- Effective Planning
- Awareness & Purpose
- Active listening
- Marketing
- Industry Knowledge
- True Rest
- Managing Team Growth

The benefit of this type of psychologically holistic framework is that it empowers young people to develop skills, resilience's and confidences that increase their self-esteem, and sense of self-worth.

This provides a life-long capacity to engage with the world around them, from the personal and emotional protection of an 'Inner locus of evaluation'. This is the only factor, known to reduce the risk of ongoing state engagement and cost. It is also the factor that increases successful and healthy relationships.

6. A 360 degree, wrap around response that saves lives and money.

Psychology has been a successful tool in understanding criminality after the fact, and increasingly as an investigative tool, it is rarely used as a tool for prevention of crime. Especially when the perpetrators of the front end criminal act is a 'Minor'. There are multiple sources, over the last 3 decades, that have presented solid psychological reports on the impacts of social, economic, environmental and educational factors that contribute to the situation that is now playing out in every village, town, and city; on buses, trains, long distance coaches and taxis across the country, with vulnerable people in social housing targeted along with justice hostels, children's social care homes, and the elderly, there is not an element of life that is untouched by the exploitative and opportunistic nature of the criminal collectives that benefit from the fragmented, reactive, isolated system, that is failing to collectively protect the vulnerable.

The perception of many is that the challenge is just too much, the range and capacity of the criminality is just beyond the reach of the establishment. with the current and historic approach this is a fair assertion to hold. APA believes that an evolution of mindset, awareness and approach will have an organically beneficial impact on reshaping that assertion. Elevating, Providing, Increasing and Creating a psychological baseline that not



only disrupts the criminal collectives, protects the vulnerable but also builds a framework that reduces the recruitment capacity of the organisational criminals.

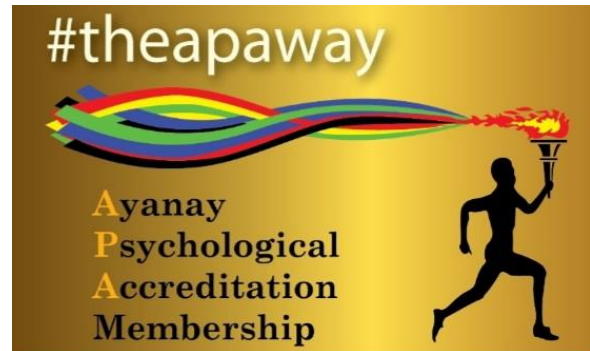
